


ARAG Study Trust in the Rule of Law

Results Report all Countries in Comparison

Trust in the rule of law is highest in Norway and lowest in Italy.



Trust in the rule of law (in %)¹



Statements about the rule of law 1/2 (Top 2 in %)¹





General evaluation of legal insurance (in %)¹



Legal problems in court in the last 10 years (in %)¹





In the Netherlands, people are least likely to avoid court proceedings.
